A WORD ABOUT THE PARENT-TEACHER FORUM

The Parent-Teacher Forum was set up many years ago on the guidelines provided by the Central Board of Secondary Education. The General Body of the Forum constitutes of all the parents whose children are studying in the school. The Executive Committee of the forum is a nominated body represented by Parents and teachers of the school. The Principal of the school is the Ex-officio President of the Forum.

The PTF plays a pivotal role in making decisions from time to time regarding the welfare of the School. It facilitates closer association between parents and teachers in their efforts to make the School an ideal place for all round development of children. It also offers parents a platform to express their views freely and frankly, thereby involving them in a process of mutual participation aimed at the welfare of the children studying in the school.

OUR EXPECTATIONS FROM PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Parents must realize that school is a virtual second home for children. They need all the considerations in their favour by way of safety and security, love and co-curricular work. It is from this point of view that we expect parents and guardians to follow the norms given below meticulously.

1. **The status of the students would not be changed in any condition once admitted in the capacity of boarders.**
2. Parents are expected to go through the school calendar carefully and make a note of important dates and events, especially Parent Teacher Meetings (PTM), Tests and Examinations. We expect the parents to come in large numbers and meet the concerned teachers to discuss not only the academic progress, but also other areas of personality development like attitude, aptitude, interests, likes, dislikes, confidence etc.
3. Parents/House Masters may please see that their children adhere to the school uniform strictly.
4. Wearing fancy shoes, jewellery, keeping unruly and unkempt hair will not be tolerated.
5. Parents/Guardians are not permitted to enter class rooms/boarding areas to meet their children or to seek unscheduled talks with teachers during the school hours.
6. In case of an emergency, parents/guardians must meet the Principal and adopt a course of action in consultation with him.
7. No strangers are allowed to meet children.
8. By allowing children to use motorized modes of transportation such as scooters and motorcycles, parents jeopardize their safety besides the illegality involved in permitting an underage child to use these means.
9. Once the child has come to school, parents and guardians are not permitted to take him back home before the school gets over.
10. During the school hours, no leave is permitted unless there is a major emergency. In such cases, the permission of the Principal is MANDATORY.

11. Parents and guardians must know that NO SCHOOL TEACHER IS ALLOWED TO TAKE PRIVATE TUTIONS. As such, they should not insist on the teacher of this school to accept private tuition for their wards.
12. Parents and guardians must immediately inform the School in case there is a change in their address and/or telephone number.
13. Any communication that parents wish to make with the School must be addressed to the Principal of the school only.
14. Last but not the least; we expect parents and guardians to be cordial and polite with the staff of the school and hostel even in the most taxing situations.

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE

Discipline is the law of nature, without it, nothing works. Inculcating discipline among children is the most significant aspect of education which is not confined to the school alone. Parents must cooperate with the School in observing these norms.

1. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence from school, habitual late coming, leaving the school premises without permission, disobedience and any type of unruly and objectionable behaviour are the grave acts of indiscipline on the part of a student which can lead to his suspension / expulsion from the school.
2. Students on their way to and from the School are expected to deport themselves in a responsible manner. Being on the road in any mode of transport entails caution, care and attention to safety rules.
3. Day Scholars who expect to reach home late after the school due to personal reasons must inform their parents/guardians in advance.
4. Students are expected to take proper care of the school property. It is there for their convenience. They should not break any item of furniture and fixtures within the school/hostel premises.
5. They should not write, scratch or engrave graffiti on desks, chairs and other surfaces.
6. They should not damage or remove things, belongings to other students.
7. Damage done even by an accident must be reported at once to the Principal /Class Teacher/House Master. Anyone who notices something damaged must report the matter to any of the personnel mentioned above.
8. If a student causes damage to the school property in a classroom, the entire class occupying that classroom will be charged the cost of the damages.
9. In the event of collective damage to school property in a classroom, the entire class occupying that classroom will be charged the cost of the damages.
10. The school is not to be held responsible for the loss of personal belongings. It is not advisable for students to bring valuables to the school.

11. Running and shouting in the school premises is not allowed. While using staircases and corridor, all must keep to the left. Loitering in the lobby and the office areas is strictly forbidden even during the recess.
12. Students are strictly forbidden from purchasing eatables from unauthorized vendors/hawkers near the School premises.
13. No money collection for any purpose is allowed to be made in the school without prior permission of the Principal.
14. It is compulsory for all students to attend the assembly.
15. All our students should observe high standards in their general get up, deportment and conduct.
16. Use of foul unparliamentary language is a reproofing and punishable offence.
17. All students must converse in English while they are in the school.
18. Using unfair means in a test or examination is a grave offence. A Student, who is found using unfair means, will be awarded zero in the subject and will be issued a strict warning. Repetition of the same will result in his suspension / expulsion from the school.
19. Students are not permitted to carry cellular phones or other electronic gadgets to the school/hostel. They are not allowed to use school phones without permission. They cannot be called to the school offices to attend to phone calls during school hours. They are also not permitted to make a request to any of the school employee to use their mobile phones.

RESIDENTIAL ARRANGEMENTS

The school is a residential-cum-day school for boys of class LKG to XII. The Boarding houses are looked after by Housemasters, supported by Assistant Housemasters and other House staff.

The students of classes IV to VIII are accommodated in Residential Wing Junior and the new admissions are accommodated in a separate Residence in Residential Wing Senior while the Students of classes VIII are housed in Bhabha Residence and those of Class IX to XII are housed in Aryabhata, Bhaskar & Kalam Residences of Residential Wing Senior.

The Residencies have state of the art arrangements and amenities. They have furnished rooms for two boys each, dining halls, beautiful lawns and healthy and peaceful surroundings. All the residencies have common recreation rooms provided with suitable hostel library, e-learning, indoor games, newspapers and periodicals.

HOSTEL RULES

1. All boarders are to be compulsorily provided with school and hostel uniforms and all other enlisted items mentioned in the prospectus. In case of any shortage, local purchase will be arranged, and the cost will have to be borne by the parents/guardians.
2. Students are not allowed to keep cash, jewellery or any costly items with them in the residency.

No cash should, therefore, be given or sent to them directly. Food packets from homes are also not encouraged. In case such packets are received, they may be distributed among the boarders or the students' room-mates at the discretion of the Housemaster/Housemother.

3. Each boarder in the Residencies is allotted a room along with another boy who shall be collectively responsible for the furniture and fittings of the room. Before leaving for the summer vacation the boarders will get their rooms checked by the Housemaster / Housemother. Damages, if any to furniture and fittings will be recoverable from them.
4. Damages to the school property and loss of library books are to be recovered from the parents.
5. Boarders are expected to keep their rooms neat and tidy and not to disfigure walls, doors or windows.
6. Use of room heaters, mobile phones and such other appliances is prohibited in school & Hostel. **All such items will be confiscated under intimation to the parents and a heavy fine will be imposed & such articles once confiscated will not be returned in any condition whatsoever.**
7. Boarders must not remove any electrical fitting, lights, bulbs fans etc. from the Hostel/School. Any violation will be strictly dealt with.
8. Boarders must not remove any games material or journals from the common room. They are meant for use in the common room itself.
9. Boarders shall take all their meals in the common dining hall and should be properly dressed at meal times. Mess utensils are not allowed to be taken out of the dining hall. **Only vegetarian meals are served.**
10. Students are not permitted to purchase anything on credit from shopkeepers and hawkers. Those found purchasing items from outsiders on credit are liable to suspension / expulsion from the school.
11. Formation of societies, associations or clubs and holding meetings of clubs other than routine periodic cultural meetings of the hostel are not allowed.
12. Only a parent, having an emergency will be allowed to meet his ward except on Saturdays and Sundays with the prior permission of the Principal / Senior Housemaster only. **Parents' visits without any permission on other days of the above schedule will not be allowed.**
13. Every year, the school organizes educational tour and treks. It is mandatory for all the students.

LEAVE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR BOARDERS

1. Request for leave should be sent at least two days in advance, by the parents to the Principal directly on the following emails:

2. Leave may be granted on the marriage of real brother/sister or on the demise of any immediate family member such as parents, grandparents or first cousins. Please also note that a request for leave will only be entertained in written, or by email addressed to the Principal who is the ultimate approving authority.

3. No leave will be granted on telephone or letters sent to the students. The application from the parents must be sent addressed to the Principal, Birla School Pilani.
4. No outstation or local leave would be granted on the recommendation of local guardian or acquaintance. No employee serving the school will request or recommend for any sort of leave on behalf of the students' parents.
5. Parents and authorised relatives can meet the students in the visitors' room between 10.00 AM to 12.00 noon on Sunday and on Saturday after the school is over.
6. Parents and authorised relatives can take their son/ward on local outing or night stay on Saturday and on local outing on Sunday only, but the student must be in the hostel on Sunday by 7.00 PM.
7. If a student overstays without any information to the principal, a fine of Rs. 1000/= per day will be imposed up to three days. After that, his name will be struck off the rolls of the school.
8. Parents and authorised relatives are advised to meet the concerned House Master to know the progress of their wards. They are also advised to attend Parents-Teachers Meet (PTM) scheduled by the school.

MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

Discipline means the sincere observance of rules and performance of duties honestly. It may be noted that the observance of rules of discipline and good behaviour shall be an essential prerequisite to a pupil's continuance in this school.

Acts of Indiscipline and Objectionable Practices

1. Non-observance of the school/hostel rules by commission or omission, defiance of authorities and any sort of misbehaviour towards any employee.
2. Instigating, abetting or indulging in any act of omission detrimental to the institution or student community.
3. Theft, cheating, malpractices in the examination, misrepresentation, impersonation, forgery, perjury extortion etc.
4. Hooliganism, bullying, ragging, and any other acts of misbehaviour.
5. Moral turpitude.
6. Indulging in or instigating of violence in any form.
7. Use of any drugs or intoxicants except on prescription by a Doctor/Physician.
8. Smoking.
9. Disfiguring or damaging school/hostel property.
10. Spitting or urinating in or near the school/hostel building except at places provided for the purpose and other unhygienic and antisocial activities.
11. Breaking bound and scaling.
12. Truancy and aimless loitering.

13. Non-adaptability or adjustability to community life.
14. Using vulgar and abusive language and possession of pornographic literature.
15. Arrogant behaviour.
16. Practice of casteism, communalism and nepotism.
17. Participating in any act prejudicial to national interest.
18. Any other act or omission on the part of the pupils, which the authorities think is against the overall interest of the institution.

Disciplinary Measures

Any disciplinary action initiated against a student will be communicated to his parents. Minor offences may be dealt with by the House Masters and Teachers. Serious offences may be referred to the higher authorities. The authority may set up an enquiry and relevant facts of the report of inquiry by the disciplinary committee and the Principal's finding and recommendations shall be sent to the parents. The Principal shall be the final authority of appeal. His decision shall be final.

The following disciplinary measures shall be adopted:

1. Warning/Admonition/Reprimand
2. Fine
3. Expulsion/Suspension

INVESTITURE CEREMONY FOR SCHOOL COUNCIL APPOINTMENTS

The one, who is put in authority over others and accepts the office of Prefects, undertakes duties that are not always easy to carry out. He must obey the rules of the school in letter and spirit and ensure that others also do so. He must be exemplary not just directing others to do so. He must not be tempted to court popularity rather emphasise on doing his duty well and fairly, he will win respect, and to be respected is better than to be cheaply popular. A Prefect accepts an office of responsibilities, trust and honour. He can make the school a happy home for all, by exercising his responsibilities wisely. He is given the highest opportunity to develop leadership and communication skills.

NORMS RELATING TO WITHDRAWAL OF A STUDENT FROM THE SCHOOL

Withdrawal of a student from the school is necessitated under certain unavoidable circumstances. The norms followed in this respect are given below. Parents must read these norms carefully and comply with them.

1. If a student needs to be withdrawn from the school, the parents/guardians of that student must apply in writing at least a month in advance.
2. A student can also be asked by the school to be withdrawn on academic or disciplinary grounds including submission of false information to the school at the time of admission. Disciplinary action may even involve expulsion. The principal's decision in such matters is final.
3. Misbehaviour on the part of parents/guardians with any member of the School staff may also lead to withdrawal of the student from the school.
4. Transfer Certificate (TC) on withdrawal is issued only after all the school dues are cleared by the parent/guardian.

EXAM & PROMOTION POLICY

- If any student is found using unfair means in any exam, zero marks are awarded.
- If any student remains absent due to illness or any other reason, the re-exams are conducted only on the basis of proof (medical certificate) and the same is approved by the Principal/ Headmaster. The re-exams are conducted only for Midterm and Annual after 10/15 days of declaration of results.
- The procedure for the re-exam remains the same as in the main exam.
- A student whose attendance during the academic year is less than 75% may not be promoted to the next higher class as per the CBSE rules.
- A student detained in any class is allowed to repeat the same class for one year, but if he fails to earn clear promotion to the next higher class at the end of the repetitive year, he is issued a transfer certificate.
- If a child gets less than 33% in any of the subject (Cumulative Theory and Practical) will be marked FT (Fail in theory)/ Fail (non-practical subjects)/ FP (Fail in Practical).

- A child getting more than 33% will be marked passed.
- The Final Result of Class VI to VIII is on the basis of Term 1 and Term 2.
- The Final Result of Class IX and XI will be calculated as follows:
 - 10% of Pre-Mid Term
 - 30% of Mid Term
 - 10% of Post Mid Term
 - 50% of Annual Examination
 - Excluding Practical Exam
- Promotion criteria for classes I to V: No student is detained or given supplementary.
- For classes VI to VIII: No student is detained but retest is given.
- For Classes IX & XI: If any student fails in more than two subjects, the student is detained in the same class. If any student fails in two subjects, the supplementary exam is conducted and only one chance is given to qualify the subject.
- For classes X & XII: Promotion policy is as per CBSE guidelines.

COMPLAINT HANDLING

1) Complaints:

- a) The complaints can be made by the interested parties or the stakeholders against the following:
 - i) Processes, process- owners and process- members.
 - ii) Against process- owners to the Principal
- b) The complaints must be made in writing to the process-owners with complete details of the complainant (name, address) and the description of the problem.
- c) If the complaint has no detail of the complainant or the description of the complaint is not adequate, the process- owners have the right of dealing with the complaint as per their discretion or they deem fit.
- d) The School/ process-owners acknowledge the complaint within 7 working days or earlier depending upon the nature of the complaint from the date of receipt (complaint through emails/ feedbacks/ complaints boxes/ complaint registers).
- e) Complaints received through mails/website will be acknowledged by the IT In charge and forwarded to the concerned process owners, while the complaint boxes will be opened by a 'three-member committee' in each wing, every Monday (next working day if Monday is a holiday) and forwarded to the concerned process owners.
- f) Complaint registers will be kept at the main gates of each wing and with the Mess Manager. The Mess Manager will present the register to the Bursar every day. The registers at the Main Gates will be presented every day to the following:

RWS: Bursar
RWJ: Headmaster
DWS: Dean Academics & SA
DWJ: Headmaster
- g) The School/ process-owner evaluates the complaints in term of nature, scale and magnitude for

credibility, impartiality and transparency of the School functioning.

- h) The School / process-owners with specific team members investigate the complaints and collect the relevant data for it, within 7 working days or earlier depending on the nature of the complaint.
- i) The School / process-owners form the investigation teams, if required for proper investigation, data collection, discussion or visit for the redressal of the complaint.
- j) If there is no substance in the complaint, the process-owners can exercise their right to dispose it off at this stage. The complainant is informed of the decision.
- k) In charges of respective wings are informed about the complaints and a copy of each complaint is sent to the Principal also.
- l) The School's investigation team prepares a report of the investigation. The report contains the recommendation regarding the complaint, it also includes the need for corrective actions.
- m) In case evaluation establishes need for detailed investigation, the process-owners can form a committee as per the requirement, on his own discretion or can appoint a representative to carry out such investigations.
- n) The process-owners communicate the decision to the complainant.
- o) The process-owners follow each complaint to conclusion and initiate possible actions if any. The process-owner ensures that no complaint remains open or unattended.
- p) The Acc. Coordinator assesses and reports to the Principal about the effectiveness of the action taken in the performance review meetings.

2.0 Appeals:

- a) The interested parties or stake holders can file an appeal against the decision to the process-owner.
- b) The appeal must be filed within 10 days of the receipt of the decision by the complainant. The appeal must be written and submitted along with the necessary documents.
- c) The process-owners verify the appeal along with the documents submitted. If the appeal is to be dismissed the process-owner shall inform the complainant accordingly. Otherwise the process-owner forms the appeal committee to handle the case.
- d) The process-owner provides all the support to the committee during the investigation. The Appeal Committee informs the Principal/ Dean Academics & Student Affairs/ Headmasters about the complaint / the case being taken by the Appeal Committee.
- e) The Appeal Committee asks the appellant, to present the fact in person. The decision of the Appeal Committee is final in this context.
- f) The Appeal Committee may ask any of the staff or person to help in discharging the appeal based on the facts.
- g) After the investigation, the committee prepares a report including the recommendations pertaining to the Appeal.
- h) The process-owners inform about the report of the Appeal Committee to the Principal/ Dean Academics/ Headmasters.
- i) The process-owner implements the recommended action.
- j) The decision of the Appeal Committee is final.
